GRADUATION PRACTICE

The graduates wear cap and gown.

Cap and gowns as well as other graduation items such as announcements are ordered through Jostens. A time will be announced when Jostens is on-site at Calvary Academy to discuss options.

It is suggested that the young men wear a shirt and tie, dress slacks and dress shoes.

A light colored dress is suggested for the young ladies since their gown is white. Comfortable dress shoes are suggested.



Students must be in compliance with Calvary Academy dress code and the following modesty guidelines: able to sit, stand, walk, and move about without exposing any cleavage, midriff, buttocks, undergarments, or any body parts that are generally considered to be private.

GRADUATION PARTY

Often after the graduation ceremony, the students like to have a celebration together. This is a parent-sponsored event, not organized by the Academy. It's helpful if one or two parents volunteer to coordinate the event.

In the past, the senior class has chosen to gather in the CA gym for a party with their class, family, and friends and then they have selected to go out to eat or do something fun together after their party.

We do make resources available to the parents such as the use of the facilities for the party, tables, and chairs - the church does charge a nominal fee for rental.



GRADUATION PARTY

The gym party typically consists of tables for each graduate to decorate and cupcakes/punch. This offers a chance for guests, teachers, and other students to come congratulate the graduates, bring a card or gift, and take pictures.







SELECTIVE SERVICE

- Almost all male U.S. citizens, and male aliens living in the U.S., who are 18 through 25, are required to register with Selective Service.
- It's important to know that even though he is registered, a man will not automatically be inducted into the military. In a crisis requiring a draft, men would be called in sequence determined by random lottery number and year of birth. Then, they would be examined for mental, physical and moral fitness by the military before being deferred or exempted from military service or inducted into the Armed Forces.

COLLEGE VISITS

Questions to ask when choosing a college:

- Does the personality of the college align with my personality?
- Will I be able to succeed at this college?
- What is the total cost per semester?
- What financial aid, grants or scholarships are available?
- What will be my total debt upon graduation?



COLLEGE VISITS

It is important to visit colleges. A college visit form is available from the office so the absence is excused and does not count towards the five days missed in a quarter for the All-Starr program.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Money to pay for college or career school

- Grants
- Loans
- Work-study
- Scholarships

States, colleges, and private scholarships have their own eligibility criteria.

Be sure you know what you need to do to qualify.



WHO CAN GET FEDERAL STUDENT AID?

- U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- High school graduate/GED holder
- Eligible degree/certificate program
- Valid Social Security number
- Males registered for Selective Service
- Satisfactory academic progress



How much federal student aid can I get?

- In general, depends on your financial need.
- Financial need determined by Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and cost of attendance (COA)
- EFC comes from what you report on FAFSA
- COA is tuition, fees, room and board, transportation, etc.
- COA EFC = financial need



COLLEGE LOANS

Subsidized Loan

The government pays the interest while the student is enrolled full-time in college. Interest begins upon graduation or no longer full-time.

Unsubsidized Loan

You pay the interest which begins to accrue the first day of class and continues until the loan is paid off.

Personal Loan

You pay the interest which begins to accrue the first day of class and continues until the loan is paid off.



COLLEGE LOANS

EXAMPLE:

- You take out a \$28,400 unsubsidized loan your freshman year.
- This is the only loan you take out.
- The interest rate is 4.53%, at the minimum.
- You pay nothing while in school.
- After graduation, you make the minimum monthly payment of \$294.74 for ten years.
- You will have repaid over \$35,369.40.

COLLEGE LOANS

You cannot claim bankruptcy on a college loan.

- College loans are one of the only loans that can garnish your wages without going to court.
- BE CAREFUL!!!



How much state, school, and scholarship money can I get?

- Depends on the program: do your research!
- Ask college financial aid offices for info about aid available at their schools.



How do I apply for aid?

Federal student aid: fill out Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov



What happens next?

 Each school will tell you how much aid you can get at that school.

 Once you decide which school to attend, keep in touch with the financial aid office to find out when and how you will get your aid.
